Lulav rings may seem like the last thing you want to fiddle with eruv chag but practice these seven simple steps and become a ring master!

Strip an outer leaf from a lulav and trim off the tough portion at the bottom.






Approximate the width of your leaf and make 3 folds of that length.

Pull the end of the leaf toward you, making a triangular fold and insert the tail into the gap closest to this triangle and pull tightly.


Cover the triangle by threading the tail into the same hole and pull tightly. Thread the tail through the hole a second time to form a ring.














Tuck the tail through the remaining hole to create the locking mechanism.

Slip this ring over your lulav and tighten the loop around it. Then pull the tail tightly to lock.
