

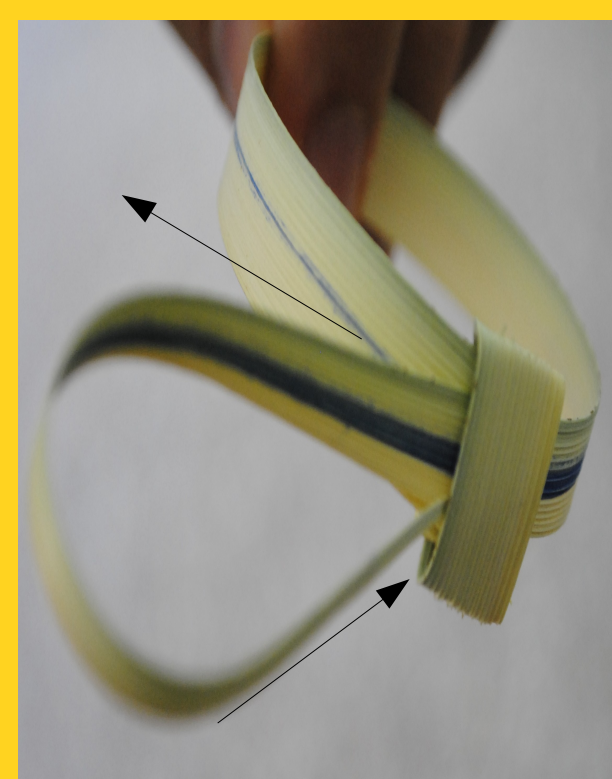
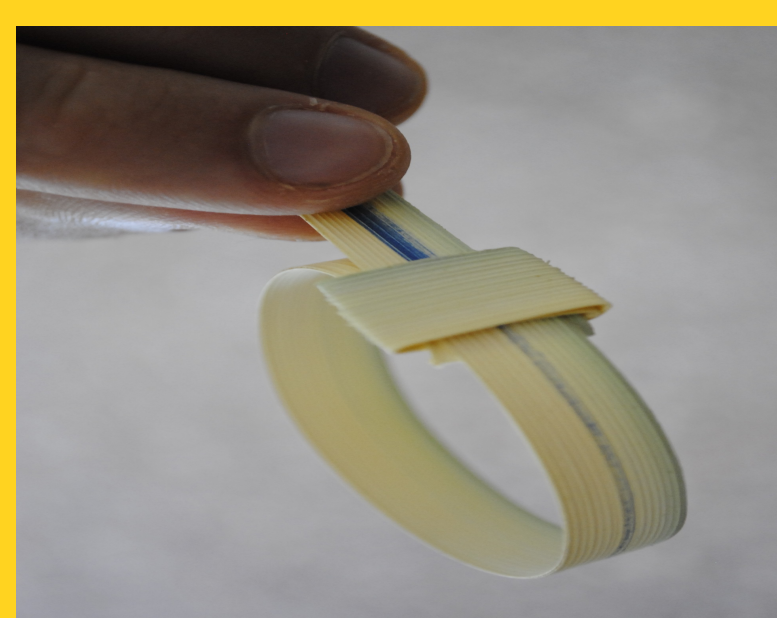
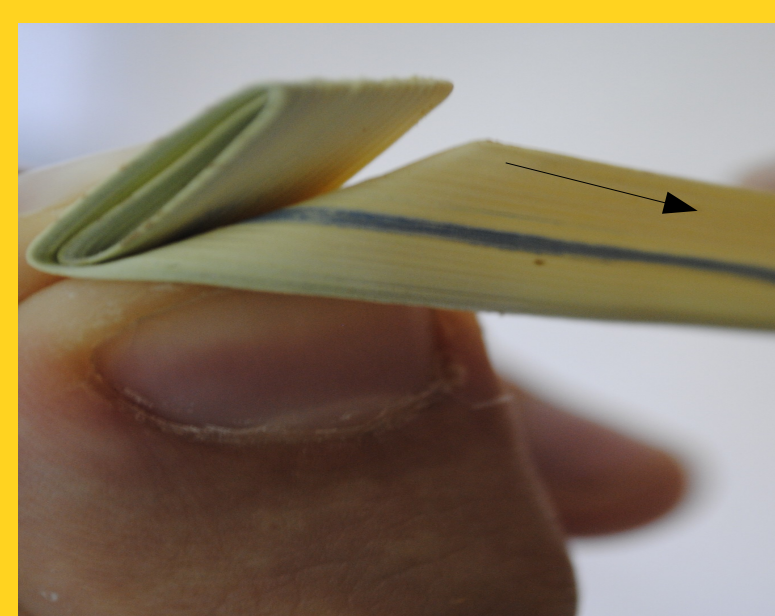
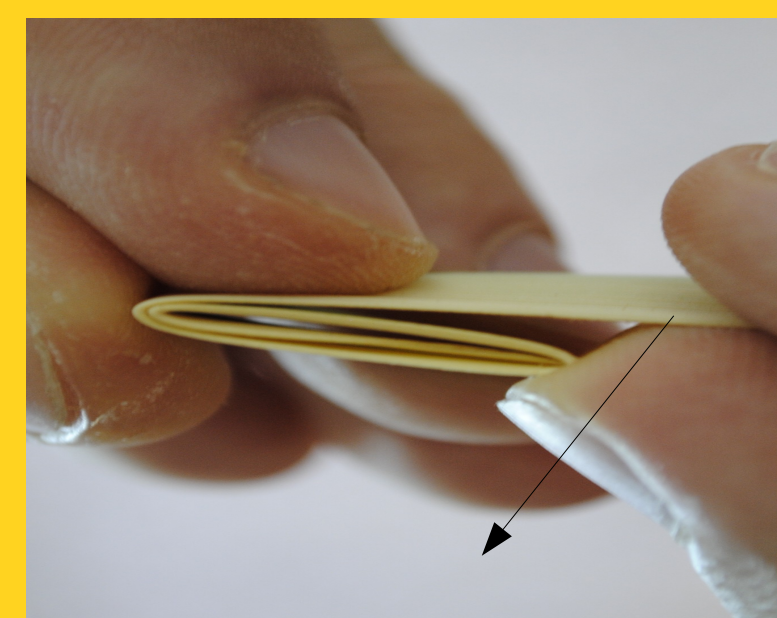
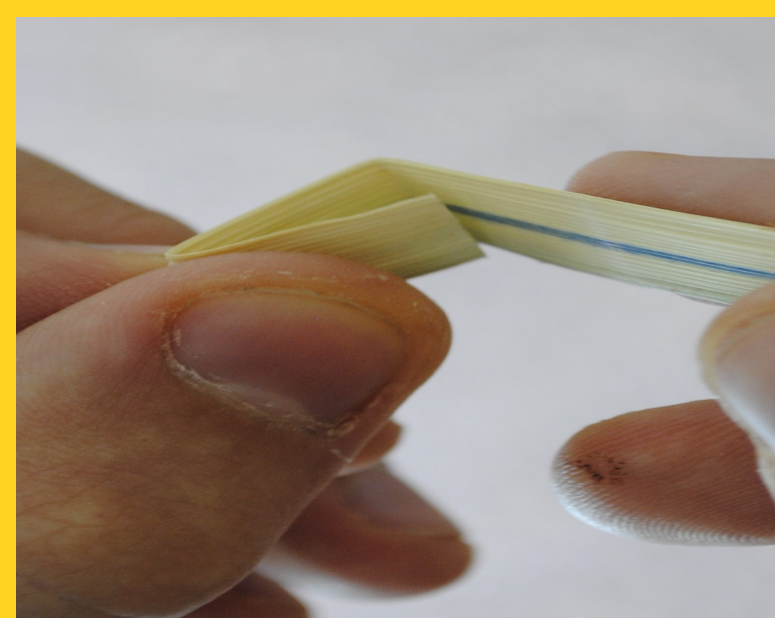
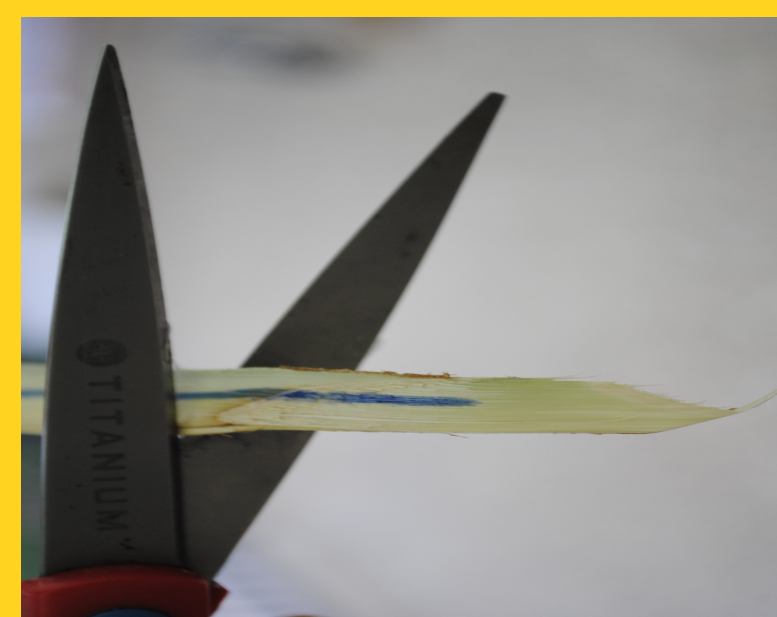
Zaide Reuven's Guide to Lulav Rings



Lulav rings may seem like the last thing you want to fiddle with eruv chag but practice these seven simple steps and become a ring master!

- 1** Strip an outer leaf from a lulav and trim off the tough portion at the bottom.
- 2** A palm leaf has two halves from which rings can be made. Separate and put one half aside.
- 3** Approximate the width of your leaf and make 3 folds of that length.
- 4** Pull the end of the leaf toward you, making a triangular fold and insert the tail into the gap closest to this triangle and pull tightly.
- 5** Cover the triangle by threading the tail into the same hole and pull tightly. Thread the tail through the hole a second time to form a ring.
- 6** Tuck the tail through the remaining hole to create the locking mechanism.
- 7** Slip this ring over your lulav and tighten the loop around it. Then pull the tail tightly to lock.
